

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Case • Colour • Size <p>They should not be adding images or backgrounds at this stage.</p> <p>Students should access the video tutorials to try to find out how to do things for themselves before asking for help: http://www.teach-ict.com/software/ppt/powerpoint.htm</p> <p><i>Teacher led discussion: Using different colours and text in a presentation</i> Stop the students from working and gather them around to listen.</p> <p>Show students ‘presentation 5’. Ask them just to watch, not to make any comments, but to think about what they are seeing.</p> <p>Show students the presentation again going through one slide at a time, and discussing what is wrong with the backgrounds that have been chosen.</p> <p><i>Individual activity: Developing the presentation through fonts and colour</i> Students should open their presentation.</p> <p>They should choose appropriate backgrounds for their slides.</p> <p>Students should access the video tutorials to try to find out how to do things for themselves before asking for help: http://www.teach-ict.com/software/ppt/powerpoint.htm</p>	<p>10 mins</p> <p>10 mins</p>

<p>Extension work</p>	<p>Students working at levels 3-4 usually have little difficulty changing colours and fonts. However, they may not base their selection on the needs of the presentation or their audience. They may need more guidance on the fitness for purpose of their selections.</p> <p>Students working at higher levels could be introduced to more technical detail, for example more complex manipulation of colours and fonts using the customised colour palette or fill effects.</p> <p>Further extension work: Action buttons and hyperlinks</p>
